Giving Tuesday is December 3rd this year and this year the library will be asking for ourselves. Giving Tuesday was created in 2012 as a simple idea: a day that encourages people to do good. Over the past nine years, this idea has grown into a global movement that inspires hundreds of millions of people to give, collaborate, and celebrate generosity.

If you haven't heard, the library is fundraising for a renovation project. Our last renovation project was started in 1999 and things have changed in the way libraries support the community. The library wants to ensure that we meet the needs of our current and our future users.

We normally do not ask for additional funding, but a requirement of the two million dollar construction grant we won through the State of Connecticut requires us to raise a matching two million dollars. We hope that we can count on your help so that we can continue to expand our services for the whole community.

The Town of Old Saybrook is a political subdivision of the State of Connecticut and eligible to receive charitable donations for public purposes under Section 170(c)(1) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.




