

# Friends of Acton Public Library

The Friends of Acton Public Library will be hosting a mini book and bake sale on the first floor of the library on Friday, March 14 and Saturday, March 15. In addition to our usual inventory of books, puzzles, CDs and DVDs, we will be selling delicious baked goods. And we will also have a table featuring handmade items including aprons for both adults and children and tote bags that can be used both for errands and for gifting. For those who are not familiar with the Friends, our mission is to support the library by providing funds to enhance the programming budget beyond that allocated by the town. We also pay for the museum passes that may be borrowed by patrons (please see the list of available passes at the circulation desk or on actonlibrary.org) and the personal hygiene items made available in the restrooms at no charge. We raise the funds by means of our annual membership drive and our periodic book and bake sales. For the past few years, we have also received generous grants from the Essex Savings Bank Community Investment Program. We appreciate all the votes from Essex Savings account holders that have allowed us to receive a share of its community investment funds.

Currently, we are also using our funds to support the library's capital campaign for its Turn the Page renewal project. Full information about the renewal project is available at the library and on actonlibrary.org. Because we are a tax exempt organization under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code, donations made to the Friends are tax deductible to the extent provided by law and may be directed specifically for use in the renewal project. Direct distributions from a donor's individual retirement account, or IRA, may also be treated as tax exempt qualified charitable distributions. Check with your tax advisor for further information on qualified charitable distributions.

During the month of April, a memorial guilt in honor of former director Michele Van Epps will be on display in the library gallery.

Michele was library director at the Acton Public Library from 2010 until 2017. Michele was instrumental in bringing the Acton Library into the LION consortium, expanding library programming, enhancing adult services, and running two book clubs for years, one a Mystery Book Club which was her special interest. Michele contracted lung disease in 2014, but it never defeated her spirit. She was known as a very caring person and was beloved by her friends, family, the library board and staff, and patrons alike.

"I was honored to be commissioned by Michele's alma mater and the Acton Public Library to make a memorial guilt. Michele's daughter Carol gave me a list Michele's passions: music, books, farmers' markets, Girl Scouts, sewing, church, coffee, travel, and Harry Potter.




